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# TOP TRAINER LAY ANGLES

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# INTRODUCTION

Thanks for downloading this manual, where we're going to look at three trainer angles for LAY betting, from the 2016 – 2018 racing seasons.

With proven performance over a three year period, we're likely to see continued profits from these angles for the foreseeable future.

Before we delve into the rule-set for each angle, let us briefly discuss our fundamental approach to finding profitable betting angles at *Lucrative Racing*:

## **Step 1: Logic, Logic, Logic.**

We have opted to focus on broadly unprofitable trainers, which have historically suffered poor performance in specific types and classes of race.

In addition, trainers usually have an "off-season", where their performance is typically the poorest, which we have identified for each of our angles.

## **Step 2: Is It Proven Profitable?**

The past performance for each angle has analysed with a fine tooth comb, to establish both substantial and consistent lay betting profit.

## **Step 3: Don't Guess, Put It To The Test.**

Past data is a good indicator of future profit, but it's by no means infallible. At *Lucrative Racing*, we believe in testing each angle live, for a minimum of 6 months.

If the live testing performance is favourable, only then will we consider sharing the angle with our readers.

## **Step 4: Review, Refine, Research**

We regularly review each angle, refine to improve future performance if necessary, and research new angles to test and potentially implement in future.

Currently, we have a total of seven profitable trainer lay angles in our betting portfolio.

Although four of these angles aren't currently available to the general public, we offer a tipping service to provide each days qualifiers for all seven trainer angles.

Without further ado, let's delve into our top three trainer lay angles...

# ANGLE 1

**Trainer: David Barron**

**Race Type: Handicap**

**Betting Season: January – July**

**Forecast Odds Limit: 10/1**

Barren trained horses perform best in non-handicap races, and from the closing stages of the flat season until years end. Focusing on handicaps earlier in the year would have produced the following results:

<b>Qualifiers</b>	<b>356</b>
<b>Lose</b>	<b>324</b>
<b>Successful Lay %</b>	<b>91.01%</b>
<b>BSP Lay Profit</b>	<b>128.24 points</b>

Notes: Betting Season refers to the times of year in which the trainer has historically been in the poorest form, providing the best opportunity to lay for profit. Trainers are unlikely to be profitable to follow outside their betting season.

# ANGLE 2

**Trainer: Venetia Williams**

**Race Class: 3 - 6**

**Betting Season: January – May**

**Betfair SP odds Limit: 11.0**

The Williams yard has historically performed best at major racing events, and in the closing stages of the year. Omitting these factors, we arrive at a lay betting angle with the following results:

<b>Qualifiers</b>	<b>301</b>
<b>Lose</b>	<b>247</b>
<b>Successful Lay %</b>	<b>82.06%</b>
<b>Betfair SP Profit</b>	<b>89.59 points</b>

Notes: Although Williams trained runners win almost 20% of the time, the odds available are generally low and therefore represent value when laying.

# ANGLE 3

**Trainer: David Evans**

**Race Codes: Flat & All Weather**

**Betting Season: May – December**

**Forecast Odds: 10/3 – 8/1**

The Evans stable has generally performed poorly in recent years, particularly from the early stages of the flat season onwards. The results from a lay perspective clearly show potential:

<b>Qualifiers</b>	<b>537</b>
<b>Lose</b>	<b>486</b>
<b>Successful Lay %</b>	<b>90.5%</b>
<b>Betfair SP Profit</b>	<b>187.35 points</b>

Notes: When lay betting at Betfair SP, your stake (also called *liability*) is the amount lost if the bet loses. Like with a win bet, the amount won varies depending on the odds received.

# CONCLUSION

The combined performance for our three Trainer lay angles are shown in the table below:

<b>Qualifiers</b>	<b>1194</b>
<b>Lose</b>	<b>1057</b>
<b>Successful Lay %</b>	<b>88.35%</b>
<b>Betfair SP Profit</b>	<b>405.18 points</b>

We can see from the stats that an annual profit of approx. 135 points has been generated so far, from 1194 qualifiers which translates to roughly three bets to place per day.

With a strike rate equating to roughly nine winning lay bets for every ten placed, and an estimated maximum losing run of 3 for every 1,000 bets placed, a 15 point bankroll is recommended.
